We have considerable lost property (some of it valuable), please see Marian to claim.

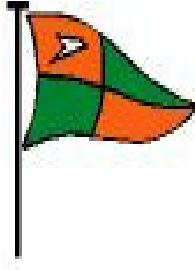
Our For Sale page is a must see with bargains as well as on our Notice Boards.

Simon and Sheryl have asked me to print a word of thanks for the award of Honorary Membership for this year. They say it was quite unexpected but a very nice surprise nevertheless.

## South African Sailing and how does it affect me?

Why should I care, how does my negligence affect SAS and ultimately my Sunday sport? This is the first part of “SAS - for sailors”, a fourteen part investigation by myself as to why I have to pay SAS fees, something I’ve been unsure of, but did because “they said so”, for a very long time. Some items may seem “no brainers”, but sometimes us sailors can’t see Port from Starboard, so I’ve assumed the lowest common denominator as the audience i.e. “Me, I know a nothing”- Manuel, Fawlty Towers

From the SAS website. *“Liaison with International Bodies. SAS is a member of the International Sailing Federation (ISAF) and represents South Africa at the organisations meetings that decide on venues for international regattas such as World Championships, the choice of yachts for the Olympic Games, changes to the Racing Rules of Racing and a myriad of other matters with a view to promoting sailing in South Africa. As such it is the guardian of the Rules of Racing in the RSA. SAS is also represented on the ISAF Medical / Anti-doping committee and liases with the SA Sports Confederation and Olympic Committee (SASCOC) over the selection and funding of South African sailors to participate in the Olympics.”*

How does this affect me?

All yachting is controlled by ISAF. They are involved in rules, measurement, safety, Olympics, promotion, boat & skipper licensing, training, competitions & classes all at a global level. SAS is our representative on this council. There is another one, and that would be your class, if you belong to an international class. So because most of our classes are not international – SAS is it. If we don’t have SAS, we don’t have representation. We are then excluded from the global game and don’t have a sailing sport in this country.

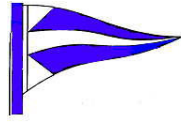
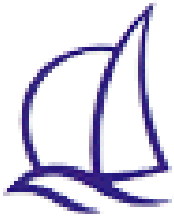
We will not be able to race as we wouldn’t have rules. Don’t even tell me we can make our own rules. Ever played pool in a pub? We might spend the whole day at skippers briefing deciding on “old” or “new” rules. We can use steroids, foul language and have fist fights after the race. What you gonna do, call the police?

We can follow our own licensing ideas and have drunken skippers and un-seaworthy boats, that won’t be able to dock anywhere else in the world. So you’ve spend a few million on your dream cat and you can’t sail to the Islands, sorry for you. We will also have no delivery skippers, a thriving new career choice for young sailors leaving school.

We will not be able to host international events i.e. BOC Challenge and the Volvo fleets won’t stop here. Durban will not be able to enter a boat in the Clipper Challenge. There will be no South African team entered in the Americas Cup. There will also be no South Atlantic Race (Cape To Rio). The list is endless.

We will not be able to enter the Olympics as South African’s, our children will have no dreams and heroes. Our J22, Oppie, 505, Mirror, Fireball sailors will not be able to go to their world events to compete. In fact no RSA sailor will be able to compete in an ISAF sanctioned event.

**Sponsorship Proposal**



The Lipton Challenge Cup was established in 1911 by Sir Thomas Lipton "I, Sir Thomas Lipton, for the purpose of encouraging Yachting in South Africa, and especially in the way of friendly contests in sailing and seamanship in deep sea yacht racing, do hereby give to the "Table bay Yacht Club" of Cape Town, Cape Colony, the Silver Cup delivered herewith...

... The Sailing Committee shall keep in view the ordinary customs of the Sea, and discourage all attempts to win a race by other means than fair sailing and superior speed and skill."

The Lipton Cup has a reputation as being the most prestigious sailing regatta in South Africa. Each year sailing clubs from all around the country send one entrant to compete in the regatta, the competition is fierce!

For the past 22 years the Lipton Cup has been sailed on the L26 one design yacht. The Challenge is such that no races may be discarded, so each boat is in top condition and can ill afford a poor finish in any race, ensuring extremely tight racing.

Tatoosh, the Lake Deneys Yacht Club entrant will be campaigning for the 2006 Lipton Cup Challenge, which will be sailed in Table Bay, Cape Town in August 2006. As training leading up to the Challenge, the team will be competing in the MSC regatta week (doubling as L26 national championships) to be held in Durban in July, as well as the Western Province championships which will be held in Cape Town two weeks before Lipton and will be used to acclimatize to local conditions and fine tune the boat.

**Justification for sponsorship**

In this letter of justification we as the LDYC team for Lipton 2006 are committed to obtaining the highest level of sponsor satisfaction. It is our intention to promote the sponsor's logo as well as the sport of sailing to the utmost. The recent media interest in South African Sailing, started through the conception of the 2007 Shosholozza America's Cup Campaign, has lead to a renewed interest in televised sailing events commonly shown on the DSTV Super Sport Channels. We believe that with the right media campaign and sufficient sponsorship we can produce a world class sailing team as well as fulfilling our advertising obligations.

## **Tatoosh Crew**

*Craig Teasdale:* Started sailing at the age of four. In 2002 he was awarded his South African Sailing colours. The highlights of his career are the following international sailing events:

- 1998 - Optimist European champs (Greece)
- 1999 - Dart World champs (Port Elizabeth)
- 2000 - Dart European champs (Holland)
- 2001 - 29er World Champs (Canada)
- 2002 - I.S.A.F Youth Worlds (Canada)

In 2003 after matriculating Craig was part of a crew consisting of sailing friends who also just completed their matriculation. The friends took the 50ft cruising yacht 'Big Reef' to the Caribbean, through the Panama Canal and onto the South Pacific. Craig returned from Fiji at the end of 2005.

*Craig Soulsby:* Started sailing in primary school, sailed in three world championships, and was awarded South African colours in 1997. He has competed in England and Ireland. He was awarded three full blues by Wits, and has made the Protea team for SASSU four times, as well as being selected for the world student games in 1998. Craig has won the Northvaal championships in GP14s, and has twice finished second at their national championships, in addition to which he has finished second in fireball nationals twice. Achievements in the L26 class include finishing second in L26 nationals in 97 and third in MSC Regatta in 2004.

*Gareth Van Zyl:* Gareth has considerable international sailing experience, finishing second in his class in Tobago Sail Week, and has logged over 5000 sea miles, with 3000 sea miles racing. He has also competed in the Cape to Rio Race in 2003.

*Rowan Hewitt:* Has over 10000 ocean miles of experience as skipper, while he also has experience in racing dinghies and keelboats. Rowan started sailing at age 6 and has two GP Series wins to his name in Optimists and two Junior Keel Boat Regattas wins. In addition to this he competed in the Cape to Rio Race in 2003

*Lynn Philpot:* Lynne has sailed lasers for ten years, in addition to which she has cruised in the Caribbean, including St Lucia and the Grenadines (visiting islands such as Tobago Keys, St Vincent, Cannoon and Petit Martinique).
